

THE ITALIAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM IN BRIEF



Credits

Each educational activity (including the laboratory and traineeship activities) are awarded ECTS credits. Each credit corresponds to 25 hours of work for the student, including all the types of activities requested (lessons, seminars, individual or group study, etc.). Academic credits are awarded not only when passing exams but also for work experience, laboratory activities as well as other kinds of activity.

The University grading system

The Italian university marks go from a minimum of 18 to a maximum of 30 with distinction. For the final thesis, on the other hand, the marks range from 66 to 110 with distinction.



STUDYING AT THE UNIVERSITY BOLOGNA

With its 23 Faculties, 69 Departments, over 200 degrees and 100,000 students, the University of Bologna is one of the biggest higher-education institutions in Italy. The University can count on a near-thousand-year history of academic activity and student life, the longest in the Western world. The history of the city of Bologna and its University are inextricably interwoven. Even Bologna's architecture is said to have been influenced by the very presence of the students: legend has it that its famous arcades ("portici") were designed in order to extend the houses to provide another room to be let out to the students.

Since the Middle Ages students from out of town and abroad have always been a significant presence at the University of Bologna. Foreign students used to have their own union (they used to be called "ultramontani", meaning that they came from beyond the Alps) that played an important role in establishing the independence of the University.

And even today, thanks to the launching of numerous exchange programmes, thousands of foreign students choose to come to Bologna, contributing significantly to the city's cultural enrichment.



2.1 ONE UNIVERSITY IN FIVE CITIES

The University of Bologna has a multicampus structure: besides the main headquarters in Bologna, the Alma Mater Studiorum has set up 4 decentralised branches, called Campuses, or 'Poli', in the cities of Ravenna, Forlì, Rimini and Cesena which are located in Romagna. About 80% of the University students attend courses in Bologna; the courses offered in Romagna are attended by the remaining 20%.

FACULTIES

Faculties in each campus coordinate and lay down the academic activities of their degree courses.

It is important to note right from the outset that some Faculties and degree courses can be found only in the Campuses of the Romagna region. For instance, if you want to study National Heritage Conservation you will have to go to Ravenna, whereas if you want to study Economics you can choose between Bologna, Rimini or Forlì. There is a Faculty of Political Sciences in Bologna, but there is also one in Forlì, while you can study Engineering both in Bologna and in Cesena, where there is the Second Faculty of Engineering. We have tried to clarify this particular organisational feature by listing under each Campus all the Faculties and the degree courses available in that location.

THE BOLOGNA CAMPUS

Bologna is the chief town of the Emilia-Romagna region, one of the richest regions in Italy, with a deep-rooted presence of the cooperative model. Bologna is also well-known for the beauty of its historic centre, characterised by long arcades, towers and brick-red buildings. The city is striking for the vast presence of medieval buildings, but equally fascinating is its Etruscan and Roman heritage.

Bologna's identity is inextricably tied to its University and its free-thinking tradition, so much so that it has always been nicknamed "la dotta" ("the learned"). The city is also known for its culinary excellence (hence, its other nickname of "la grassa" – "the fat") and the brick-red colour of its buildings in the historic centre (hence, "la rossa", or "the red"). THE CESENA CAMPUS

Ancient Roman colony, Cesena is today a small town of 90,000 inhabitants a few kilometres from the coast, and 15 km from Forlì. Its historic centre features the famous Malatesta library that dates back to the 15th century and that contains a priceless heritage of books, the so-called Corpus Malatestiano, that goes from the handwritten codexes of the 9th century to the earliest printed volumes of the 15th-18th centuries. The configuration of the surrounding territory, with its undulating hills, has fostered the development of the agricultural sector, in particular animal breeding and vine-growing.

THE FORLÌ CAMPUS

Less than one hour from Bologna, Forlì is located in the southern-most province of Emilia-Romagna, a few kilometres from the Adriatic coast. At the time of the Romans, Forlì represented an important centre on the Aemilian Way, the famous Roman road that, going from Piacenza to Rimini, linked two other strategic roads, i.e. northwards (via Postumia) and towards Rome, (via Flaminia). In spite of the heavy bombings of the Second World War, its historic centre is still well-preserved. Another interesting aspect at the architectural level is the presence of rationalist style monuments and buildings, developed during the twenty years of Fascist rule. Over the years the city of Forlì has changed thanks to the growing presence of Italian as well as foreign students.

THE RAVENNA CAMPUS

Ravenna, where around 136,000 people live, is a city of ancient origins with a glorious past. In fact, it was capital under three rules: the Western Roman Empire, the Reign of Teodorico King of the Goths, the Empire of Byzantium in Europe. The city preserves in its splendid monuments the testimony of its role as a great political, commercial and artistic pole in the succession of different civilisations. In particular, the Roman imperial period and the luminous season during which Ravenna became the centre of the Oriental Empire, in the mid-6th century, have left the city with an outstanding complex of basilicas, baptistries, mausoleums, in particular the Mausoleum of Teodorico, the churches of San Vitale, Sant'Apollinare Nuovo and Sant'Apollinare in Classe. Today a 10-km long canal connects the city to the sea, where there are numerous locations that each year welcome thousands of tourists.

International Relations Offices

Students are supposed to refer to these offices for all administrative issues that they need to carry out during the erasmus period in our University. In particular it is necessary to refer to the International Relations Offices in order to:

- confirm your arrival and departure date;
- get your documents at arrival (student card, records book etc.) and give them back at departure;
- get copies of those documents if needed;
- collect any documents that might have been sent from the home University;
- ask general information on the Exchange programme, on our University etc.

According to the Campus where the student is attending the courses, the Office to be contacted will be the Dipartimento Amministrativo Relazioni Internazionali of Bologna or the International Relations offices of Cesena, Forlì, Ravenna or Rimini.

Faculty Offices

Faculties represent an important information source for students. Many activities are organized and implemented directly by each Faculty. The offices of the various Faculties - e.g. Erasmus office, or other offices providing assistance to students - if you need to:

- find out about the timetable - beginning, end, suspension of classes, etc. The timetable changes from one Faculty to the next. You need to consult the website of the Faculty: click on the “studenti” link in the grey box on the left hand side of the homepage and then on the “calendario didattico” link;
- receive assistance on how to submit your online study plan, sign up for exams and have them properly registered (called “verbalizzare” in Italian);
- find counselling information about academic programmes available for exchange students in a given semester;
- taking part in information days for foreign students organized by the various Faculties.
- find out about lecturers and Professors, be informed about updated office hours for each Professor, etc;
- find out about the various services and spaces dedicated to students within each Faculty.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

3.1 CHOOSING THE TEACHING ACTIVITIES

Once you have completed the registration at the administrative offices of your Campus (Bologna, Cesena, Forlì, Ravenna or Rimini Campus) you can contact your Professor who is in charge of your exchange programme at the University of Bologna, in other words, your exchange coordinator; with him/her you will have to double-check the choice of the teaching activities included in your learning agreement. This is crucial as choosing the right degree course right at the beginning means starting at best your stay in Bologna University. Should you discover that the exams in your learning agreement are not available in the semester of your choice, or if they do not correspond to your expectations, you will have the opportunity to change your learning agreement and, with the help of the exchange coordinator, you will be able to choose the courses which are most suitable for your linguistic or academic needs. Your learning agreement must be signed by your exchange coordinator and sent to your University of origin.

Most teaching activities do not envisage a pre-registration or registration to the course. Attendance can be either mandatory or optional depending on the type of course, but it is always recommended to students. It is always advisable to let Professors know from the beginning that you wish to attend their course and take the related exam. Before taking an exam all students, including exchange students, must register first.

To view the whole list of teaching activities offered by each Faculty click on the “Offerta formativa” link found in the “studenti” section of the Faculty’s website.

3.2 TAKING EXAMS

At the end of each teaching activity students must pass an exam in order to obtain the related credits and final marks. If you want to take the exam, obtain the related credits and the transcript of records you need to follow the 3 steps below:

Step 1: check if you can take the exam

This check is essential to make sure that there are no administrative restrictions preventing you from taking the exam of your choice. Each Faculty may have specific rules about exams which must be complied with - e.g. some Faculties do not allow students to take a second semester exam during the first semester, or vice versa, etc. You will also have the opportunity to choose courses from Faculties other than your own. However, any choice must be always agreed upon with your exchange coordinator.

Step 2: Load the exam in your online study plan

This is indispensable if you want to obtain a transcript of records of your exams. Connect to website www.pianiweb.it and using the search engine enter as soon as possible all the exams that you intend to take.

Completing your study plan online is mandatory as in the absence of this procedure, Professors cannot formally register the fact that you have passed a certain exam and received a certain mark and number of credits - i.e. they cannot fill in the exam register. An exam register is a legally binding document (that can be digital or paper-based) and it certifies that an exam has been passed. Without this the International Relations Department and the International Relations Offices of the various campuses will not be able to certify the exam-related credits and to officially notify your University.

To recap, if an online study plan has not been completed and if a Professor fails to fill in the related exam register - either digital or paper-based - the exams that a student has passed in Italy will not be transmitted to the student's home University.

Step 3: register for the exam session

Before taking an exam students must also register for the exam session. The student's name must be included in the list of those who intend to take the exam on a specific date. Each Professor will let you know how you are supposed to register for the exam - either online or on a paper-based list. In the event that the usernames and passwords received from our Offices are not recognised by the online register system please refer to your Faculty offices (Student Registry Office, Erasmus office, if present) to solve the problem. Each Faculty has its own IT system and will provide you with a new username and password.

3.3 STUDYING ITALIAN

The University of Bologna offers all its foreign exchange students the chance to attend free Italian language courses. The courses are organised in Bologna by the CILTA (Centro Interfacoltà di Linguistica Teorica e Applicata L. Heilmann) and in Romagna by the CLIRO (Centro Linguistico dei Poli scientifico-didattici della Romagna). The courses last between 50 to 60 hours (5 ECTS credits) and take place over 5-6 weeks; they start twice a year: in September (1st semester) and February (2nd semester). These two courses are especially recommended if you need to improve your Italian before the start of classes in the first and second semester. This year exceptionally CILTA will organize (from October to December) a further Italian Language course (which will be worth 3 ECTS credits). Only the students who cannot attend the September course will be accepted and, as the number of places available is limited, preference will be given to students with a limited knowledge of Italian in order to enable them to follow the lessons. Online entrance tests and oral tests are scheduled to place the student in the appropriate course tailored to his/her level of knowledge (for test deadlines you should check the web sites of the Language Centres). Each student can take part in just one course, either in the first or the second semester depending on the time of arrival in Italy, i.e. students arriving in the first semester cannot follow the February course. At the end of the course the student who has done at least 70% of the lessons will take the final test. At the end of the final test no grade will be awarded, instead students will be provided with a pass/failed certification. If the test has been passed, students will be given 5 ECTS credits.

3.5 STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

The Servizio Studenti Disabili (Disabled Students' Office) represents a reference point for students with special needs studying at Bologna University, including foreign students who intend to spend some time in Bologna for study. We recommend students with special needs to contact the Disabled Students' Office in order to check the accessibility of the structures. In case of accessibility problems or other difficulties this service will help students in finding possible solutions according to the students' various needs. It is important to be familiar with some key characteristics of Bologna University: it covers a very wide area: cities of Bologna, Forlì, Cesena, Rimini, Ravenna.

The university structures and facilities are part of the city, they are not connected as in a traditional university campus. In particular Bologna is a medieval city and courses are often taught in historical buildings, at some distance from each other and sometimes they are not easily accessible. The Disabled Students' Office can help students to get in touch with administrative offices as well as with lecturers and Professors. The Office also provides services such as tutoring, support to teaching, taking students to class, etc.

3.6 RESIDENCE PERMIT FOR NON-EU STUDENTS

Non-EU students must request a residence permit within 8 days from their arrival to Italy. After registering at University students must fill in an application for a stay permit. The International Relations Department and the campus offices are at your disposal to provide you with useful information for application completion and to give you the names of other structures which can support you. If you intend to complete your application on your own you must collect all forms (called kit) available at some post offices. You must follow these directions: the kit must be completed, signed and taken to a post office in an unsealed envelope together with:

- a stamp duty to the value of Eur 14.62;
- your original passport and a photocopy of all its pages;
- a statement from Bologna University, released by the International Relations Department at registration;
- a photocopy of your health and/or injury insurance policy. The insurance policy must cover the whole stay period.

When you hand in your application you:

- must fill in a payment form (bolletino postale) for your residence permit card. Price: 27.50 Eur;
- must fill in a registered mail form to send the kit. Price: 30 Eur.

On the coupon of the registered mail you will find a barcode, user id and a password. These details will enable you to control the state of your application on the website. Go to website: <http://www.portaleimmigrazione.it/> and enter the area reserved for foreign students. Keep the payment receipts. In the event of a police check, such receipts prove that you have formally applied for a stay permit.

3.7 LOOKING FOR A FLAT

The University of Bologna helps students to find accommodation.

IN BOLOGNA

The SAIS (Student Accommodation and Information Service) provides information to international students on a wide range of solutions for accommodation both in student halls or in private apartments with other students. To be included in the S.A.I.S. database, you will have to fill in and submit an online accommodation form that you can find on the S.A.I.S. homepage. You will have to do this at least a month before your arrival and right after having completed your online registration at the University of Bologna since you will need your registration number to sign in for the SAIS web services.

We would like to inform you that the number of rooms available in student halls is limited. On the other hand, it is fairly easy to find an accommodation (in single or double rooms) in student flats.

3.10 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

The methods for accessing the National Health Services vary according to the students' university status.

- **EU Students with the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** These students may be able to refer directly to a GP (General Practitioner) of the National Health System. This means that they can go to a GP free of charge. Through the GP of their choice students will have the opportunity to obtain medical tests and specialized visits in public or other approved health structures after paying a fee called a “ticket”. (See par. “Choosing a GP”).

EU students should however collect detailed information with the Health System of their country of origin to find out about the terms and conditions - and possibly also the necessary forms and procedures - in order to be entitled to health treatment in Italy, specifying the duration of their stay.

- **EU Students without EHIC card** These students must take out a private insurance policy either before their departure or upon arrival in Italy. After that they are entitled to refer to a GP of the National Health System or alternatively to a private doctor. Visits performed by private doctors and some medical tests are to be fully paid for by patients. Patients may have a refund from their own insurance company depending on the conditions stated in their own insurance policy - we recommend that you read your insurance policy carefully to find out if you are eligible for a refund).
- **Non-EU students** Non-EU students must purchase a private insurance policy before their departure if they want to obtain a visa. After that they are entitled to refer to a GP of the National Health System or alternatively to a private doctor. Visits performed by private doctors and some medical tests are to be fully paid for by patients. Patients may have a refund from their own insurance company depending on the conditions stated in their own insurance policy - we recommend that you read your insurance policy carefully to find out if you are eligible for a refund). Alternatively such students can register with the National Health System after obtaining a visa. To register with the National Health System they must pay an entry fee of Eur 149 and they will be assigned a GP free of charge (see paragraph “Choosing a GP”). In addition, they will be entitled to pay reduced fees for specialized tests and visits in public or other approved health structures.

REGISTRATION WITH NATIONAL HEALTH SYSTEM

To register with the Local Health Structure (called ASL) students must refer to the health register of the district where they live. To find out about districts please consult the website of Bologna ASL or call the toll-free number 800 663366 (for speakers of languages other than Italian call Mon to Fri, from 2.30 to 4.30 p.m., Wed, Thu and Sat from 9.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.

CHOOSING A GP (GENERAL PRACTICIONER)

Non-EU students opting for the registration with the National Health System after paying the related fee and EU citizens possessing a EHIC card or similar card released by a corresponding institute in their home country are entitled to choose a GP. GPs can be chosen at the front desk of a health register. Medical visits are free of charge and are performed in a doctor's office - rarely at the patient's home. GPs may, if necessary, request specialized visits for patients,. Such visits can be booked and obtained in a public health structure.

Bookings must be made through the CUP Network (Unified Booking Centre - toll-free number 8488 84888). The CUP network is accessible from any ASL Office and from most pharmacies after paying a "ticket", i.e. after paying only a part of their total cost.

3.11 LEISURE AND SPORT

If you are interested in organised sports activities, you should go to the CUS (University Sports Centre), which can be found both in Bologna and in the university sites in Romagna. The CUS deals with the organisation of the University sports activities and manages all its sports facilities. All sports courses begin at the end of September, last 3-4 months and, generally end in May. In addition to university competitions and tournaments, the CUS also organises Summer and Winter Campuses. To enrol at the CUS, you just need to go to one of its offices taking a passport photo, a student id, a medical certificate stating you are in a good state of physical fitness, in an original copy bearing the following words: “idoneità alla pratica sportiva non agonistica”. It is also possible for you to have a medical check-up directly at CUS. The cost of the CUS card is of 11.

If you are looking for somewhere to relax or a place where you can spend your leisure time, the city has several parks. The largest and best-known in town is undoubtedly Giardini Margherita, the ideal place for a walk, for jogging or roller-blading. Another large green area is Parco della Montagnola extending between Via Irnerio and Via Indipendenza, where every Friday and Saturday a typical market of ethnic and second-hand products is held. For anyone who has a liking for botany, the City's Orto Botanico is one of the oldest botanical gardens in the world - definitely worth a visit!

The city parks observe specific opening hours and have strict rules for visitors.

The hills surrounding Bologna and the several urban and suburban parks are an important city heritage. Near Casalecchio, you can find Parco Talon, well connected by the no. 20 bus route, while in the surrounding hills of Bologna there are Parco Cavaioni and Monte Donato (Bus route 52B).

Finally, you can spend some of your leisure time exploring the magnificent villas, and historical mansions in the city or in its outskirts: Villa Ghigi, Villa delle Rose and Villa Spada are all surrounded by marvellous parkland open to the public.

3.12 OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT OR A POST OFFICE ACCOUNT

BANK ACCOUNT

To open a bank current account and carry out all the normal banking operations you need a tax code. To obtain this code, you need to go to the Uffici delle Entrate, which in Bologna are located in:

Please remember to take with you your passport or ID, as well as your permit of stay.

We suggest you should shop around before opening a bank account, as there are various offers and services for students (better interest rates, lowering bank charges, etc.).

If you are not going to deposit large amounts of money, the cost item that mostly determines the convenience of a bank account are the charges applied to each transaction: bank transfers, withdrawals, cheque-book, paying-in, stamp-duties and other commissions. A set number of transactions may be free: naturally, the higher this number is, the more convenient the bank account is. The opening of the bank account does not imply expenses, but there may be charges for closing the account. You should check this cost before choosing a bank.

Credit Cards and Cash Dispenser cards (aka Bancomat)

In general, the major bank charges concern:

- issuing a credit card;
- annual fees;
- bank charges for each transaction.

In case of theft or loss of the credit card or of the cash card:

- block the credit card immediately by calling your bank; to block a cash card, you can call the freephone 800 822056;
- report the theft or loss to the Police;
- keep the police report for at least 12 months.

POST OFFICE ACCOUNT

In order to apply for a Conto BancoPosta you must fill in the “Modulo di apertura Conto BancoPosta e servizi aggiuntivi” (Form to open a Post Office account and related services), available online at the following web site: <http://www.poste.it/bancoposta/contobancoposta/moduloapertura.pdf> and in all the post offices. The form, properly filled in and signed (4 copies), must be delivered to a post office together with the following documents:

- photocopy of your identity document (driver’s licence, passport, identity card or, alternatively, only for non-EU citizens, the permit of stay);
- photocopy of tax code (also for foreign citizens the tax code must be issued in Italy).

CARTA GIOVANI (YOUNG PEOPLE’S CARD)

The City of Bologna offers young people aged between 15 and 29 a special card called “Carta Giovani”, which includes a series of discounts at a number of shops and for a wide range of services. The “Carta Giovani” is completely free and expires when the holder reaches his/her 30th birthday.
